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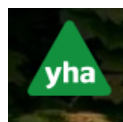

Activities

Seaside Safari

- » *Twice a day the sea retreats, revealing a fascinating world of strange plants and fabulous beasts. Explore habitats and identify these creatures that make this world between land and sea their home.*
- » Pupils get to meet some of our coastline creatures in their natural habitats. They learn about coastal safety, marine conservation, habitats, zones of the rocky shoreline and food chains. They are shown how to handle creatures safely and taught about the importance of leaving places how we find them. An inspiring and interesting activity for all!



Activities

Walking with dinosaurs



- » *The action of the sea reveals to us that we are not the first creatures to live on this coast. The Jurassic has left many traces, which we will discover, identify and enjoy!*
- » Children first meet some of our areas oldest inhabitants in a brief classroom presentation, before exploring the scars left on our beach. Here we will find several iconic fossils, having already learned about their formation and preservation. This module is beach based, and builds an understanding of our deepest past while also considering erosion and coastal safety.

Activities

Firepit and traditional tales



- » We arrange the fire in the Hostel grounds and with toasted marshmallows and steaming hot chocolate we create a magical evening that delights all ages. Local stories and legends (not scary ones) are told and comparisons are made between past and present.
- » But how much truth is in these stories? You'll just have to find out

Accommodation

Boggle Hole offers dormitory style accommodation, with rooms sleeping between 2 and 6. Some rooms are ensuite and some share bathroom. Rooms typically have a sink and storage for belongings in each room.

Please be aware that it may be quite cold and could rain.

- » Slippers/slipper socks (not sliders or flip flops)
- » 4 sets of underwear and socks
- » 3 pairs of trousers (one indoor, 2 for activities)
- » 4 t-shirts/tops
- » Sun cream, sunglasses, insect repellent
- » 2 jumpers/sweatshirts
- » Waterproof coat, gloves and hat
- » Pajamas
- » Toothbrush and toothpaste
- » Shower gel/soap/shampoo/deodorant
- » Carrier bag for wet/dirty clothing
- » Waterproofs and wellingtons/ waterproof boots with good grip
- » Rucksack
